The Hiscock Salver was donated by Misses D and M Hiscock in 1968, originally being for the pennant playoff between the North and South A Grade Pennant Zones. In 1972, the Hiscock Salver became an annual team's event for players who had played pennant in that year. The conditions were changed in 2010 to allow Pennant and Handicap Match Play team members and caddies to play in the club's team.



TERMS OF COMPETITION

1. COMPETITION PROCEDURES

- 1.1. The competition will be played according to the Rules of Golf adopted by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews and subject to such Local Rules that are in force at Carrington Park at Eagle Ridge.
- 1.2. The main championship is scheduled to be played over 18 holes aggregate stableford (teams of four). There will also be an individual Stableford event in two grades. Grades to be determined at the close of entries.
- 1.3. The field for the championship will be limited to 50 players with entries accepted on an as received basis.
- 1.4. The leading team will win the Salver and prizes for each team member, and the leading individual player in the A Grade and B Grade divisions will also receive a prize.
- 1.5. A member of the winning team may also win an individual trophy.
- 1.6. All ties shall be decided by count-back as recommended by Golf Australia.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1. Eligible players are female amateurs who have represented their club in either GPV Women's Pennant or Peninsula Women's Matchplay or caddied in either of these events, this year.

3. ENTRIES

- 3.1. The entry fee is \$180 per team (Inc. GST) and must be paid at the time of entry.
- 3.2. Entries shall only be made via the online registration portal at: <https://gpv.net.au/full-calendar-of-events/>
- 3.3. GPV shall have the right to refuse the entry of any person/team without being required to give any reason for such refusal.
- 3.4. The draw for the competition will be sent to players and available on the event page on the GPV website approximately one week before the event.

4. PRIZES

As disclosed in Competition Procedures.

5. CHAMPIONSHIP COMMITTEE

The committee shall consist of the GPV match committee and the host club match committee. In the absence of a full Championship Committee, such members as may be present at the time may give a decision, and any decision so given will be deemed to be a decision of the full Championship Committee. In the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, the championship committee may shorten the competition, appoint another day or days for completion of, or may transfer play to another course. Protests must be made to the championship committee not later than 10 minutes after the conclusion of each round.

6. REFUND POLICY

As per the GPV Terms of Entry and Refund Policy.

7. MOTORISED TRANSPORT

Carts may be used by all competitors subject to host club availability. Bookings and payment for carts are to be made by players through the pro shop.

8. CLUBS AND BALLS

List of Conforming Driver Heads: Model Local Rule G-1 is in effect. Penalty for making a stroke with a club in breach of Local Rule: Disqualification. List of Conforming Golf Balls: Model Local Rule G-3 is in effect. Penalty for breach of the Local Rule: Disqualification. Note: An updated List of Conforming Clubs and Balls is available on www.randa.org.

9. PRACTICE (RULE 5.2)

In stroke play, Rule 5.2b is modified in this way: A player must not practise on the competition course before or between rounds. Exception: All recognised practice areas within the bounds of the course may be used by players for practice on any day of the competition.

10. PACE OF PLAY (RULE 5.6)

Will be strictly enforced. Each group must maintain its position on the course with respect to the group preceding them. Any group with a clear hole in front of them will be considered out of position. The penalties will be issued to individuals in such groups who by their pace contribute to such delay. Warnings may not be issued prior to penalties.

11. DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES

In accordance with Rule of Golf 4.3a(1), a player may obtain distance and direction information by use of a distance-measuring device. The provisions of Rule 4.3 apply in relation to Use of Equipment.

12. SUSPENSION OF PLAY (RULE 5.7)

The following signals will be used to suspend and resume play:

- Immediate stop for imminent danger - one prolonged note of a siren
- Stop for a non-dangerous situation - three consecutive notes of a siren
- Resumption of play - two consecutive notes of a siren
- Note: When play is stopped for imminent danger, all practice areas will be immediately closed.

13. RETURNING OF SCORE CARD

A team's scorecard is officially returned to the Committee when the players have left the recording office/area with both feet.

14. RESULTS OF THE COMPETITION - COMPETITION CLOSED

When the Salver is presented to the winning team, all other prizes given and the results of the competition are officially announced, the competition is deemed closed.
